This access statement does not contain personal opinions as to our accessibility but aims to accurately describe the facilities and services that we offer all our visitors.

The Trustees take their responsibility for providing universal access provision very seriously and adhere to the Equality Act accordingly. We work hard to provide the highest level of access to the whole site.

Pre-Arrival

Ryton Gardens has a clearly signposted entrance on Wolston Lane:





There are footpaths on Wolston Lane but limited pedestrian access or cycle paths on the approach from the A45.

The nearest railway station is Coventry, approx. 6 miles from Ryton Gardens.

The nearest bus stop is in Wolston Village situated on School Street approximately 0.8 miles from Ryton Gardens. There are no buses that directly pass the gardens.

Taxis are available to book via a member of staff. Allens Taxis are a local company who can also provide accessible taxis and can be contacted on 02476 555 555.

To plan your journey by car you can use www.theaa.com/route-planner/route Simply enter your postcode and ours (CV8 3LG) to get directions.

Appropriate Clothing

As many of our events will be outdoors, we advise you to wear sensible clothing appropriate to the event description and anticipated seasonal weather.

Please note that some walkways and areas of the gardens are uneven, so we also advise that you wear suitable footwear.

Car Parking and Arrival

We have 25 car parking spaces including 2 clearly marked/signposted blue badge spaces. These are opposite the main building:

The carpark surface is flat tarmac with raised stone flag pathways which slope down gently. There are various raised flower/grass beds connected to the pathways. The footpath over the tarmac car park is clearly marked in yellow with a pedestrian sign.





The drop off point for taxis is directly outside the main building.

There are tall car park lamps which illuminate automatically making visibility clear at night and in the early mornings.

The pathways around the building are flat, even stone flags and the carpark is level tarmac with clearly visible lines for cars and pedestrians.

The Garden Organic entrance is situated at the right-hand corner of the main building:





Please proceed through the wooden archway and follow the path to the right. Please ring the doorbell and a member of staff will greet you. There are no steps or inclines to reach the door and it is a short walk over a stone flag pathway.

Indoor Facilities

All areas inside are accessible by wheelchair and the floor is lino and level throughout.

The area is evenly and well-lit with overhead lighting.

There is a deep, single step down at one rear exit from the main building into the garden, however, alternative step-free access is available.

The Gardens

Please note that the garden is a working environment, and so conditions may be different on the day. Please take care of uneven surfaces, trip hazards or objects that may cause an obstruction.

Some events may have more limited accessibility in some outdoor areas; however, this will always be clearly stated in the event information if applicable.

Most of the garden surfaces are accessible. However, there are small amounts of gravelled areas which may be difficult to manoeuvre over. All pathways, doors and gates throughout the garden are wide enough to accommodate a wheelchair.

There are several areas of the garden which are covered with grass. Some areas may only be accessible by travelling across the grass which can be uneven and bumpy.

The entrance/exit to the gardens is via a gateway between the outdoor classroom and main entrance and is level throughout.

Benches and chairs are located at various points around the garden. A covered seating and table area is available for visitors to enjoy.

The garden includes pond areas. Please take care whilst around open water. Your course instructor/guide will show you where the pond is during your visit.

Visits to the Heritage Seed Library working areas

Some events, where specified, include visits to the Heritage Seed Library (HSL) working areas at a different part of the Ryton site, where there are restrictive spaces and uneven surfaces. These may include:

- The seed cold store, seed cleaning room and drying room narrow access in places.
- External paths in HSL growing spaces uneven grass and gravel surfaces, slopes, and narrow paths. Some areas may only be accessible by travelling across the grass which can be uneven and bumpy.
- Polytunnels and cages steps and narrow access into and inside polytunnels and cages (mypex paths less than 50cm wide). Obstacles such as irrigation pipes and sprawling plants. Warm and humid on sunny days.
- Glasshouse concrete flooring. Some narrow spaces (less than 50cm wide) between moveable work benches at fixed height.
- Up to 200m walk from external toilet block.
- Up to 250m walk from main building (vehicle access drop off may be available via service road).

Public Toilets

Three toilets are located within the main building including one which is accessible.



Toilets are not externally locked and there is no key required to open them.

All toilets are bright and evenly lit.

The toilet is fitted with grab rails. One is situated to the right of the toilet and is a drop-down variety and there are two either side of the sink.

There are no steps to access the toilets and floors are flat and level throughout.

If guests require assistance there is an emergency call system activated by a red cord to the right side of the toilet.

The sink is low enough to be accessible by wheelchairs and is fitted with lever taps.

We also have use of an outdoor toilet block which will be highlighted to you during the health and safety briefing if in operation.

First Aid

Many of our staff are first aid trained. There will always be someone on site and available who is first aid trained at all events.

First aid kits can be found in the main office, the staff break-out room, the gardeners shed, the facilities coordinators shed and the HSL potting shed. All of our first aid kits are fully stocked and checked regularly.

If you were to have a near-miss, accident, or injury whilst on site please report it to one of our staff members, however small it may be, so that it can be reported to prevent future occurrences.

If there was an accident or injury it would be reported on our online system 'SafeHR'.

Prior to your session you will be provided with a 'Fire and safety briefing'. This will highlight site procedures and key staff members.

Fire Procedures

There will always be a trained Fire Marshal on site and many of our staff have fire awareness training.

If you locate a fire and it is safe to do so – sound the alarm or let a member of staff know. Leave by the nearest exit and go to the assembly point.

The assembly point is located in the car park situated near the hedges by the road.



If there is a fire, please leave any belongings and proceed calmly to the assembly point. Do not return to the building for any reason until authorised to do so by a fire marshal.

Covid 19 and other illness

We have numerous procedures in place in reaction to Covid 19 including our risk assessments.

If you are feeling unwell or have recently experienced any symptoms of illness, we would ask that you let us know and do not attend the event as a precaution.

Please wash your hands frequently and correctly (for at least 20 seconds) when onsite.

Hand sanitiser is provided at all entrances to the building.

Crockery provided is colour contrasted with the table where possible.

Indoor facilities

Tables in the 'Bocking' meeting & training room are well spaced apart with enough room to accommodate a wheelchair or pushchair.

There is natural light in the meeting rooms. It is evenly and well lit.

The flooring is lino and level and even throughout.


