Our Approach

We offer a range of services that can be selected in isolation or as a full package

1. Consultation, site survey, and advice

Garden Organic can provide a site assessment taking into account location, existing habitats/wildlife, existing land use, soil type, topography, natural sunlight, drainage, etc. In addition, we will provide a face-to-face and/or online co-design session with tenants and staff to establish their aims and ambitions for the space available. This process will determine the outcomes for the project and the impact you and your tenants wish to have on the community, land, and wildlife as well as act as a guide for the production of a 'road map' to develop the garden project.

2. Garden design

We can provide a professional, co-designed garden layout, involving staff and tenants. We will follow the specification and budget to co-create a space that everyone feels a sense of ownership of.

3. Installation

According to the recommendations outlined in the site assessment and garden design stages, we can help with the installation of the garden. Our input will vary depending on the needs of you and your tenants however where possible we will engage all stakeholders in creating the space and any future ongoing maintenance.



4. Training, support, and engagement
