


## Garden Organic Members Area

**From the Garden Organic website, the Members Area can always be accessed from the top of the blue menu (pictured below), regardless of which page you are on.**





This will take you to the login page. Type in the email address you gave when registering in the first box, and your password in the second box. Then select 'Log In'.




You will then see this screen, telling you that an email has been sent that you will need to go to for finishing the setup process.



Your email will look like the one below. Use the link shown below to set your password.




Then choose 'Log In' to change your password.




